On bin collection day

- At least one metre apart on the kerb
- Facing the road
- At least one metre apart from recycling crates, trees, telegraph poles and other obstacles
- Out before 6am on the day of collection or the night before
- Return bin to your property as soon as you can after collection

City to Soil Green-lid bin

As an Armidale Regional Council resident, you are provided with:

- ✓ 1x 240 litre green-lid City to Soil bin
- 1x kitchen caddy
- 1x roll of compostable BioBags (approx. 1 year's supply).

Any additional bins/caddies/bags, need to be purchased from Council's Customer Service Centres.



What can go in your kitchen caddy?

- Any food scraps (raw or cooked food)
- Loose tea
- Coffee grounds
- Fruit and vegetable peelings
- Leftovers
- Eggshells
- Bones
- Seafood scraps

- ✗ Tissues or paper towels
- Cling wrap or food packaging
- Cutlery and plates
- ✗ Coffee pods
- ✗ Medicines

What can go in your green-lid City to Soil bin?

- Kitchen waste (described above)
- Leaves
- Branches
- Prunings
- Grass clippings
- Pizza boxes or recyclables
- Disposable cups or containers
- ✗ Glass, plastics and metals
- Treated timber or building materials, including sawdust
- Chemicals, fertilisers and insecticides

Food and garden waste collected in City to Soil bins is transformed into high-quality compost at the Armidale Waste Management Facility. This compost is available to local farmers and residents, providing a valuable resource to improve food production.

Compost availability is subject to testing requirements and processing times. Please call (02) 6772 7090 for more information on compost availability and deliveries.

Recyclables Black crates

As an Armidale Regional Council resident, you are provided with:

2x 55 litre black crates1x crate with a lid for Paper & Cardboard1x crate without a lid for other recyclables.

Additional crates can be presented for collection and are available to purchase from Council's Customer Service Centres.

What goes in your crate (with lid) for paper & cardboard?

- Clean paper
- Clean cardboard
- Milk and juice cartons

What goes in your crate (without lid) for other recyclables?

- Empty steel, aluminium, aerosol cans
- Plastic containers and bottles
- Glass bottles and jars
- Aluminium/steel pots and pans
- Clean aluminium foil (scrunch up)
- Clear plastic bags and bubble wrap.

Bag the bags - place clean plastic film and bags in one bag.

- ✗ Soiled paper and cardboard
- ✗ Batteries and other hazardous waste
- ✗ Electrical items
- × Nappies
- × Polystyrene
- Bottle tops and lids
- ✗ Any other soiled and dirty items.

Please remember to:

- Take lids off bottles and jars.
- Rinse and clean jars, cans, bottles and containers.
- Place larger recyclables next to crates e.g. cardboard boxes.



Recyclables collected in the crates are taken to the local Materials Recovery Facility to be sorted and processed. The sorted materials are then sent to recycling facilities to be converted into new products such as packaging, containers, paper and bottles.

As an Armidale Regional Council resident, you are provided with:

 1 x 140 litre red-lid Landfill Waste Mobile Garbage Bin.

What can go in your red-lid Landfill Waste bin?

- Disposable nappies and sanitary items
- Soiled or nonrecyclable packaging
- Band-aids
- Bottle tops and lids
- Ceramics, glassware, Pyrex ovenware
- Chip packets
- Cigarette butts
- Unusable clothing and textiles
- Waxed paper and cardboard
- Used stationery (pens, pencils)
- Broken toys
- Polystyrene (inc. cups and trays)

- ✗ Batteries
- ✗ Fire extinguishers
- 🗙 Paint
- ✗ Fluorescent tubes and globes
- ✗ Gas bottles
- ✗ Household batteries
- ★ X-rays
- ✗ Motor oils
- ✗ Other oils
- Smoke detectors
- ✗ Kitchen and garden organics
- Clean paper & cardboard
- Clean recyclables e.g. cans, bottles, containers, etc.

Avoid or reduce waste to landfill by:

- Buying products and fresh food with minimal or no packaging
- Reusing or recycling packaging where possible
- Donating items to charities or holding a garage sale
- Repairing broken items
- Avoiding disposable items

Drop off for **free** (a) Community Recycling Centres
